Pastoral Column

Today, St. Paul writes about the different parts of the body and how they are all important. Certainly the same is true for the Body of Christ. Through your baptism, each one of us became a member of the Body of Christ. I was speaking to a priest friend of mine recently and we had a serious conversation about how every member of the Body of Christ participates in blessing the others. I asked his permission to share his words with you. He said, "please do." I paraphrase his words below.

Thank you for sharing your blessings with us. As a family of believers, we need each one of you. Each one of you has gifts to share with us. No one person's gifts and blessings are more important than another's. Certainly, your gifts and blessings are different than your neighbor's. But none is more important than another. When you join us in worship, you bless us. You bless us with your presence, your gifts, your hospitality and your prayer. In turn, you allow us to bless you. We bless you with our presence, our gifts, our hospitality and our prayer.

When you decide not to join us in worship, you withhold from us the blessings you bring. We are less blessed when you are not with us. At the same time, when you stay home, you prevent us from blessing you. You are less blessed when you do not join us. The blessings are mutual. We need your blessing as much as you need our blessing. We are better people when we are blessed by more people.

Sometimes we think that the blessings we have to offer are not as important as the blessings another offers. Nothing could be further from the truth. When I was at the seminary, I was taught to do theological reflection. That means that I was taught to look for the presence of God in all people, all events and all situations. I have been blessed by homeless people and wealthy CEOs. I have been blessed by children and adults, men and women. I have been blessed by the healthy and by the sick and dying. I have been blessed by those who stand strong in their faith and in those who are questioning their faith. I have been blessed by families and single people. I know that I have also blessed people, but the blessing I have to offer is never more important than the blessings I have received from them.

The only physical presence God has these days is the physical presence of the Body of Christ....that is, all of us. We are the heart, the hands and the feet of Christ. We minister to one another. We reach out to those in need. We pray for one another. We love each other. Let us be ever more aware of the many ways we bless one another.
