## Pastoral Column

As we continue this Lenten journey, let us be aware of God calling us to be better human beings. Let us be attentive to those times when we struggle to live up to God's call to love others with unconditional love, when we fail to reach out to others with gentle hands and loving actions. Let us pray for the strength and courage to make the right decisions in difficult situations. Let us seek forgiveness when we err, and offer forgiveness to others whose actions and words hurt us.

In order to do these things well, we need to pray. We need to ask God to help us become better imitators of Christ. We need to take time to LISTEN to what God has to say to us. That means that there needs to be an opportunity to HEAR God when God speaks. Perhaps when we pray, we should turn off the radio, the television, the computer or the ipod. Don't answer the phone, don't text, just listen. SILENCE. Although God *can* certainly speak in any situation, God often speaks in the silence. If silence intimidates you, begin with smaller increments...5 minutes, 10 minutes, 15 minutes. Build your way up to longer periods of silence. If you do it often enough, not only will you get used to it, you'll begin to enjoy it. Let us spend more time with God, including some silence, that we might hear what it is to which God is calling us.

In addition to spending more time in personal prayer, I would also encourage you to consider doing something extra to deepen your faith this Lent. Our cluster parishes, our District 10 parishes and the Random Lake Ecumenical Association have a wide variety of offerings that can help us grow closer to God this Lent. There are several opportunities for praying the Stations of the Cross in our cluster. In addition, in this bulletin are notices for a variety of events: Soup and Sacraments, Random Lake Ecumenical Lenten Prayer Services, a Lenten speaker series, a marriage enrichment program, a series on the Introduction to the Theology of the Body and Doctrine and Donuts. There is also a complete listing of the District 10 offerings for this Lent and Easter season in the back of our chapels. Please pick one up.

It is true that some of these offerings require a little travel, but I encourage you to consider that a little travel is never a problem when we want to go shopping, to the movies, or out for a night on the town. Besides, Lent is a spiritual journey, so let's just consider the physical travel part of the trip!
