### **Pastoral Column**

I just got back from a mission trip to Barren Springs, VA. During the week, we did a number of projects for several different churches. There is an organization in Barren Springs called Neighbor 2 Neighbor, which is made up of about 10 churches of different denominations. None of them are Catholic churches because there are very few Catholics in the area.

It was our second mission trip to Barren Springs in two years, and I was again impressed by how well these churches work together. The people in Neighbor 2 Neighbor are Methodists, members of the Church of God, Assembly of God, Jordan's Chapel, Pickett's Chapel, a Pentecostal church and smaller "house churches." A house church is a church that develops after someone decides they feel called to be a minister and opens a church in their home. These little churches grow by word of mouth. Some of them last a long time and some fade away.

Each church helps the others with activities such as cutting wood, building decks and handicapped ramps, helping families who experience tragedies like fires, feeding hungry children through the "Blessing in a Backpack" program, painting homes, building prayer trails, doing yard work, etc. A newer project that is just beginning is a beef project where two families are involved in helping raise steers so they can have frozen beef available for families in need.

It doesn't matter which church to which they belong. There's no talk about winners and losers. If someone needs help, they get it. These are churches that are seriously about the mission work of Christ. They love one another. They care for the needs of one another, both inside and outside of their churches. They are the hands, feet and heart of Jesus. Their squabbles are few. They even attend each other's church services.

As I was heading back home, I did a lot of thinking and praying about our parishes here. We are all one denomination and can't seem to get along. Certainly, a lot of good things happen here. However, recently there has been a lot of arguing. It makes me sad, and I think, probably, it makes Christ sad as well. If we put Christ in the center of our decisions instead of our personal wishes and agendas, perhaps we will be able to be as open and welcoming to the other churches in our cluster as these different denominations in Barren Springs are to one another.

Let's stop talking about winners and losers. There can only be one winner in the long run, and that is Christ. As one staff member said, if Christ doesn't win, we all lose. Let us all get on the battlefield and help in Christ's victory.

Let's keep praying for one another.
