Pastoral Column

Today is the feast of the Most Holy Trinity. Today's feast is all about the Trinity...three persons in one God. We believe in a God of relationship. We believe that the three persons in the Trinity are homoousius (ho-mo-oo-cee-us). That means that all three persons are of the same substance, the same essence. There is no difference between the divine reality of the three persons.

We believe that this relational God is loving, merciful, forgiving, healing, compassionate, just, reliable, good, omniscient (God knows everything), and infinitely wise. At different times in our lives, we experience the Trinitarian God as a judge, parent, friend, advisor, confidant, brother, among other images.

As Catholic Christians, we believe that we are created in the image and likeness of God. What exactly does that mean to us? That means that, like God, we are called to live in perfect relationship with one another. Of course, we are not God, so the "perfect" part is never completely realized. Yet, we are called to strive to come ever closer to living in more perfect union with one another. This is true with everyone, not just the folks we love most, or understand best, or those who can reciprocate that reality most fully.

None of us lives out this reality in the same way. Each of us has been given unique gifts and talents which we are to share with others. How do we live out the reality of being created in the image and likeness of God? How do we make God more present in our world? How do we find God's presence in others, our homes, our workplaces, our communities, our world or the Church? How do we share the presence of the Triune God with those we meet on a day-to-day basis?

I invite you to join me in taking some time this week to consider the many opportunities we each have to share the God of relationship with others. I encourage all of us to recognize our need for one another...those with whom we agree and those with whom we adamantly disagree. We cannot live in isolation. We become more like God when we live in relationship and harmony with one another. The better we are able to do that and the more the world experiences this relational God, the more "real" God becomes in our world, the more we will experience peace in our lives, and the more we will truly love one another.

Let's keep praying for one another.

Vocations - We hear a lot about praying for vocations. Please keep praying. Although there haven't been any recent parishioners from our cluster who have followed a call to priesthood, we do have several who have been called to ministry. Judy Longrie, of Our Lady of the Lakes earned a Certificate in Lay Ministries on May 12 from Cardinal Stritch University. Two young women from Holy Rosary are currently answering the call to religious life. A few years ago, a young woman from St. Mary's-Lake Church did so as well. Holy Rosary has two parishioners who hold Masters degrees from St. Francis Seminary (Tim Jacobs has a Masters of Pastoral Studies and Deb Hamm holds a Masters of Divinity). Our cluster also shares Deacon Gerry Malueg, who was a member of Little Kohler at the time of his ordination. At least three young men from Holy Rosary are also seriously considering the diaconate. One prominent family from Our Lady of the Lakes and another from Holy Rosary have daughters who hold Masters of Divinity degrees. Let's keep praying for vocations and actively encouraging people to listen to the call to a variety of ministries in the church.
