Pastoral Column

I have worked in parish ministry for almost nine years now. I have seen so much good in my years working for the church. There are many faithful, dedicated parishioners in our cluster that give so much time, talent and treasure to their parishes and the wider church. I have the unique perspective of being in the "know" when small miracles happen. What do I mean by that? When local families in the community have dealt with incredible tragedy, I am often privy to many of the unbelievably generous donations made to these families. At Christmastime, I am often a go-between between generous parishioners who want to help and families that need assistance.

I also get the chance to sit with parishioners who are hurting, grieving, sick, troubled and depressed when I visit them or they stop by to talk. Although it feels good when someone tells me I've been of help, I don't generally take the credit, for this is the work of Christ. Through our baptism, we are each called to be the hands, feet and heart of Christ.

I am always amazed at the many ways that Christ touches us through other people. This isn't only true when we reach out to help others. It is even more true when we find ourselves in a situation when we have to accept (or ask for) help from others. It is often much harder to ask for help than offer help. It humbles us. I've been thinking and PRAYING a lot about humility these days during and following the PAR process.

It's easy to think we have all the answers. We like to be right. We like to protect our own interests. That is true of all of us, no matter which path we think is the correct one for our future.

None of us have all the answers. The gift of humility (and it IS a gift) allows us to step back from our own perspective and really listen to what others have to say. Humility allows us to actually seek the opinion of those with whom we disagree. Humility allows us to really listen to what they have to say. My hope is that the conversation, the listening, happens on both sides.

Let us keep praying for one another, that we may all be granted the gift of humility as we continue to listen to one another and plan the best path for our parishes and our future generations. May we be open to the Holy Spirit to find the path to which Christ is calling us so that we can continue to minister well to God's people, no matter which buildings we choose for our worship celebrations.
