Pastoral Column

Today's second reading is one that is often at the center of debate between different Christian denominations. St. Paul makes it clear in this passage that salvation comes through faith in Jesus Christ, not through works "of the law."

The Catholic Church has always placed great emphasis on good works. In fact, the Catholic Church has placed so much emphasis on good works that many people believe that they can help earn their salvation by doing good works.

Perhaps the difference here is the phrase "works of the law." St. Paul tells us that we cannot be saved by "works of the law." He says nothing in this passage about "works of faith." As Catholic Christians, we believe that if we have true faith, we will do good works. Works based on a deep and lasting faith are "works of faith," not "works of the law." We don't do good because it is the law. (It is possible to do the right thing for the wrong reason.) As Catholic Christians, we do good because we have faith. All people of true faith do good works. It is impossible for people of faith to separate acts of love, generosity, forgiveness, mercy and justice from their faith.

It is also true that good works can grow faith. I have seen this over and over again when I participate in mission trips. So many people I know (including myself) went on their first mission trip because it sounded like fun. This is especially true of youth, but I have also witnessed this reality in some adults. After ministering to people in need, the mission trippers find their faith deepened. They are closer to Christ. They are more prayerful and ready to do more "works of faith." What may have begun as works of fun or "works of the law" have now become something entirely different: "works of faith."

I'm not sure if different Christian denominations will ever agree on the argument between faith and works, but I think we can all agree that "works of the law" cannot ever help a person find salvation. I think we can also agree that there is such a deep connection between true faith and doing good works (works of *faith*) that it is sometimes difficult to separate the two. May we all continue to deepen our faith and reach out to care for others with our "works of faith."
