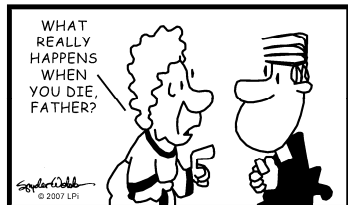

Pastoral Column

In today's Gospel, we hear one of several stories from the Gospels on the multiplication of the loaves and fishes. This story appears only once in Luke and once in Mark. In Matthew's Gospel, we hear two multiplication stories. Scripture scholars tell us these stories are stories of the Eucharist. Jesus feeds God's people.

Some Scripture scholars say Jesus didn't really multiply the loaves and fish. They argue that instead, by sharing what the apostles had, Jesus encouraged everyone to share the food they had brought with them, since most people in that time would not have left home without provisions for the day. These scholars say the miracle is not so much an actual multiplication of loaves and fish, but an opening of people's hearts and minds to the needs of those around them. A call to all people to generously share what they have with others. An opening of selfish concerns to caring for the needs of one another, even those people who were strangers. If this was the reality behind the story, it is still a "miracle." It is often uncomfortable to share what we have with those we don't know. It can be scary to reach inside our own "stash" and give it away.

I know that Jesus is capable of multiplying loaves and fish if he wants to. It doesn't matter so much to me which is the truth. What matters is the message: If we trust in him, Jesus will care for all our needs. Jesus will nourish us, both physically and spiritually if we believe in him.

As I was praying over today's Gospel, I was thinking about what this passage says to us today, here in our little villages of Random Lake, Dacada, Adell, Cascade, Waldo, Hingham, Fredonia, Little Kohler, Holy Cross, the Town of Saukville, the Town of Port Washington, Belgium, Lake Church, Oostburg and Cedar Grove. (I hope I didn't miss anyone.) Perhaps Jesus is encouraging all of us to open our hearts and minds to the needs of others, to listen to those with whom we disagree, to find some common ground. Perhaps Jesus is encouraging us to find ways that we can make better use of our provisions. Perhaps God wants us to find ways to share our financial, spiritual, physical and volunteer resources with one another so we may better meet the needs of ALL God's people.

Perhaps, like the multitude in the Gospel today, we need to face our discomfort and our fears of reaching out to those we don't know and find ways to share in God's Eucharist. To pour ourselves out for the needs of one another. That's what we are about as Catholic Christians.
