## **Pastoral Column:**

Today we hear the hymn in Philippians about Christ Jesus emptying himself of his divinity to become our Savior. Never before has this hymn struck me the same as it does today. Why the difference? First, last week at the Our Lady of the Lakes Parish Mission, we were reminded that Jesus calls us to love each other with agape love...a love that mirrors the incredible love of Christ Jesus...a love that puts God and others' needs first in our life...a love that reminds us not to judge others...a love that – lived well – helps others discover Christ in their lives in poignant, tangible ways.

Second, as Lake Church and Holy Rosary continue their merging process and participate in choosing a name for the new parish, I am reminded of a retreat Mass I attended. After the consecration, the priest held up the Eucharist and said, "See who you are. Become what you eat." That was a powerful statement. If we could all remember that we are all called to be...and become...the Body of Christ, what a difference our parishes, communities and world would be. And I was reminded of a parish named "Body of Christ" that I visited on my first mission trip. They took seriously the call to be the Body of Christ in our broken world... perhaps because every time they gathered together, they were reminded that is precisely what they were called to be.

Third, today's second reading reminds me that we are called to imitate Christ's love and humility in every relationship we have. That is definitely easier said than done. It seems an impossible task to completely duplicate Christ in this manner, but I am reminded that if I can continue to move ever closer to that kind of agape love, all my relationships will be stronger and I will be a better human being and a much more genuine disciple of Christ.

That is Christ's call to all of us: to love others with deep agape love, to make God and other people priorities in our lives, to be generous with our forgiveness, to humble ourselves, to love others deeply enough that we risk great pain...even to the point of death. That is quite a call for us to live into reality...and we need the support of one another to have any chance of succeeding.
